



2019 November Update for ED Providers

This reference provides an overview of the changes that will occur with the 2019 November Upgrade for ED Providers.

1. Reassign Patients with Ease during sign out. You can either reassign all your patients to a current team member or perform a search

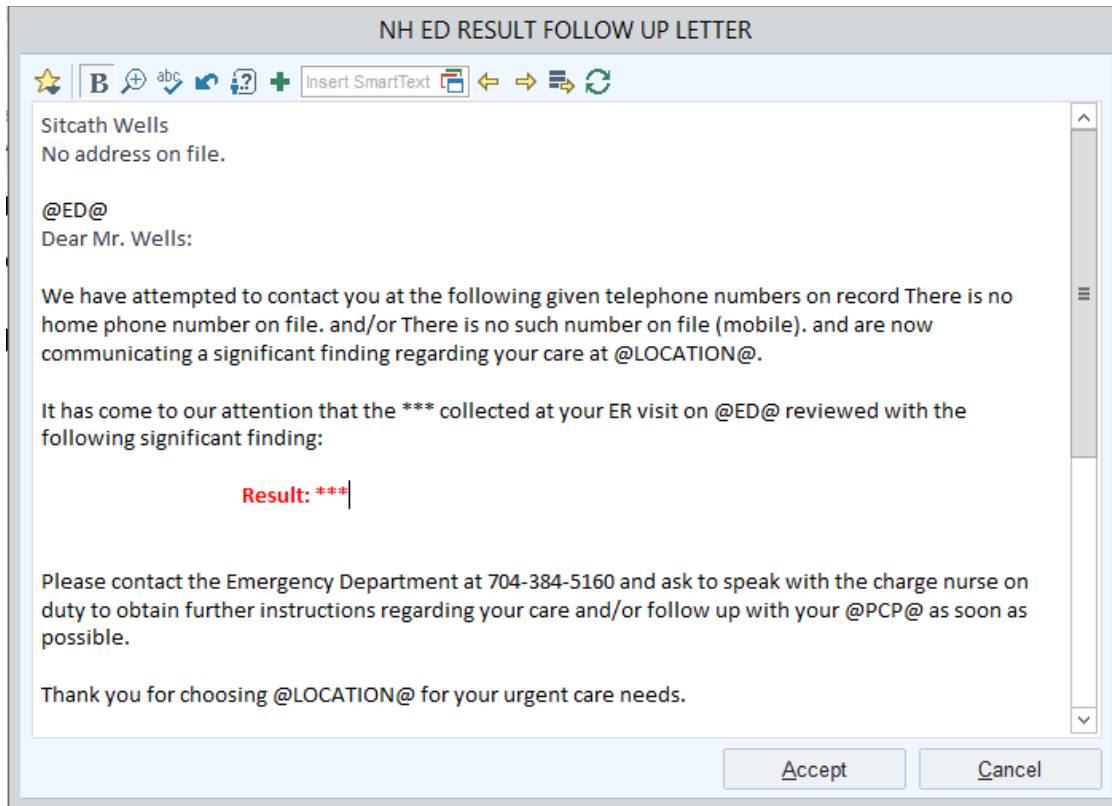
3. The “Letters” activity will be retired at a future date.

In an effort to prepare you for this future change the most commonly used letters in the ED are available in the “Instructions” section of the Discharge Workspace and once selected will attach to the AVS.

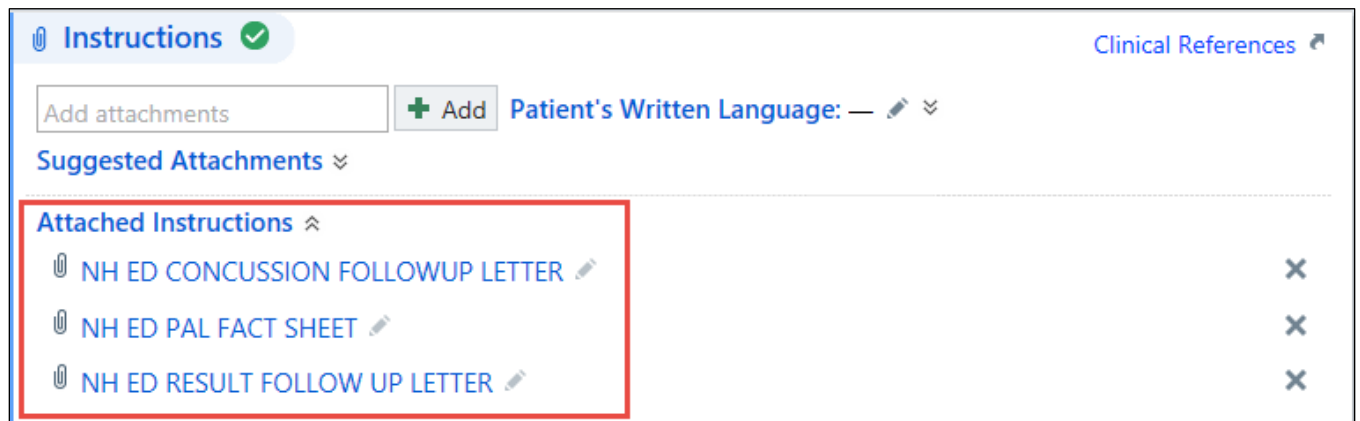
