

Isolated Flash Flooding & Severe Storms Possible This Morning


For the Western Carolinas and Northeast Georgia

OVERVIEW

Widespread showers and scattered thunderstorms will continue across the area this morning. The main threats will be from locally heavy rainfall and isolated flash flooding. A few isolated severe storms producing brief damaging wind gusts and large hail also remain possible.



 One last line of stronger storms is expected to move across the southern half of our area (roughly near and south of U.S. Highway 74 and west of I-77) between 7 AM and 11 AM. The threat of flash flooding and isolated severe weather will be highest during this time.



HAZARDS & IMPACTS

- Localized flash flooding of smaller streams and urban areas is possible, especially in locations that have received very heavy rainfall since Wednesday afternoon.
- Torrential rainfall will overwhelm storm drains and small drainages.
- Localized damaging wind gusts (58+ mph).
- Isolated large hail (1 inch or greater).

POST-EVENT OUTLOOK

 Drying is expected this afternoon. Another round of thunderstorms is possible on Friday, but the severe weather threat appears to be very low at this time.
